- **7.21.1.** Reference. In addition to the offenses set forth in this chapter, activities related to liquor within the jurisdiction of the Suquamish Tribe shall be controlled pursuant to the Suquamish Liquor Ordinance, codified as Chapter 11.2. (Res. 93-025 (part), passed Mar. 8, 1993)
- **7.21.2.** <u>Illegal Sale, Purchase, Possession of Liquor; Illegal Transfer or Use of ID</u>. (a) No person shall:
 - (1) Sell or offer for sale by the drink or bottle or keep or possess with intent to sell any liquor, except as authorized by the Suquamish Liquor Ordinance, codified as Chapter 11.2;
 - (2) Transfer an identification of age to a minor for the purpose of permitting such minor to obtain liquor, provided that corroborative testimony of a witness other than a minor shall be a requirement of conviction; or
 - (3) Attempt to purchase liquor through the use of a false or altered identification which falsely purports to show the individual to be over the age of twenty-one (21) years.
- (b) Any violation of this section shall be a gross misdemeanor. (Res. 93-025 (part), passed Mar. 8, 1993)
- **7.21.3.** Minor in Possession of Liquor. (a) No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall purchase, possess, obtain, or sell any liquor.
- (b) Any violation of this section is a misdemeanor. (Res. 93-025 (part), passed Mar. 8, 1993)
- **7.21.4.** Minor Consuming Liquor. (a) No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall consume any liquor.
- (b) "Consume" means the act of consuming liquor, the condition of having consumed liquor, and the condition of being under the influence of liquor.
