

When I was feeling sick and depressed, art and beading were the only thing that made me happy. It was very peaceful and meditative. When I started feeling better, I began incorporating stories into my beadwork. I created a flower called the courage flower, and I created another one the resilience flower. Sovereignty influences my artwork in that mainstream media and culture and education really promotes the erasure of indigenous peoples. So for me, my artwork and what I create for sovereign style is focus on in really being able to create this visual universe of indigeneity. This pandemic has made me recognize what a rich inner work artists create when they're working in solitude. Also made me focus on what we can do to stay healthy together in our communities.



We got our inspiration for these cedar masks from natural plants like cedar. The designs we use are the designs you see in our wool weaving and our basketry. The pandemic has allowed us to focus more on our work. We spent a lot of time last spring gathering cedar and the other materials we use. It's been a blessing to spend more time with our family. We've been able to share our knowledge with our children, and that's been a beautiful thing, sharing the teachings our elders taught us.

This mask was inspired by the Suquamish Tribe. We're the people of the Clear Salt Water. The abalone represents the water. You can find our art at @HolmesSyayaye.





I got inspiration from the great flood that happened generations ago. The creator told everyone to pack everything up to survive on the water. They all prepared for what was coming. In the painting you can see that they are alone, just like we are today.

The pandemic reminded me of the stories taught to me, and inspired me to incorporate it into todays live. I like to incorporate our past with our past art with our modern day art.

Charitable Funds at work across Kitsap County

The Suquamish Foundations Appendix X program exists to support non-profit organizations in the greater Kitsap County area. We love funding organizations who focus on community building/support, equity, education and sports.

Covid Relief

When Covid began affecting Kitsap Communities in a big way, with hundreds of families in need of food and basic necessities, we knew we could help make a difference. In the first and third quarter of 2020, we sent several organizations unsolicited grants to help support Kitsap County.

PAWS Partnership

Beginning in 2017, the Suquamish Foundation has created a partnership with PAWS of Kitsap County to minimize overpopulation of pets in Suquamish through Appendix X grant funds. This program has served over 75 Suquamish families with free spay and neuter for their pets. This partnership has also provided vet assistance including immunizations and other services.


