Marine Areas 6, 6A, 6B, 7, 7A, 7B, 7C, 8A, 9, 10, 10E, 12, 12A, 12B, 12C,  
12D

**LEGAL GEAR:** Hook and Line (no more than two rods per fisher);  
Beach Seines – 600 ft max. length

**FISHING SCHEDULE:** 6:00 AM January 4, 2024  
11:59 PM December 31, 2024

**OTHER RESTRICTIONS:**

1. Area 6, 6B restriction: fishing will remain closed from a line projecting from the northern tip of Protection Island, northwest to Trial Island in B.C. Canada
2. Areas 7B & 7C restrictions: fishing will remain closed until further notice
3. Area 8A restriction: fishing is closed to all gear north and west of line from Camano Head to Sandy Point on Whidbey Island and north of a line extended from Camano Head Southeast to Mission Point
4. Area 12 restrictions: Areas 12-12D will remain closed
5. Max. number of 6 salmon / steelhead/ cutthroat trout per day per fisher
6. Release all WILD steelhead UNHARMED (if possible)
7. All provisions of Title 14 (Suquamish Fishing Ordinance) apply

**EXPECTED EFFORT:** As interest and fish abundance dictates (5- 20 anglers)
