notify monitor.

Sign up required, sign up closes 4pm Wed 4/24. Gate time of 12:30 pm. Any arrivals to gate after 12:30 pm will not be admitted. No individual harvest limit, harvest may only occur during the set harvest time. Beach has been previously harvested and may be low density.

### SUBSISTENCE CLAMS AND OYSTERS OPENINGS

### **CATCH REPORTING:**

All fishers must report all subsistence and commercial landings on a Treaty Indian Fish Receiving Ticket using a valid Suquamish fisherman's I.D. card.
