CLAM & OYSTER COMMERCIAL OPENINGS

1) Clam Dig Thursday, June 11th from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM

Group: **WHITE GROUP**
Location: **Dyes Inlet, Windy Point, WP17**
Access: Access from the Anna Smith Children's Park. Walk down trail to beach then walk south 0.5 mi. Do Not trespass on private upland property.
Buyer: Buyer will purchase manila clams on beach at harvest site. Buyer will not provide bags

Group digger start time is 8:00 AM, standby start time is 8:45 AM. If you arrive after standby start time you will not be allowed to dig. WHITE IFQ: 200 lbs., Standby IFQ: remaining pounds divided equally. Approximately 4,500 pounds available

2) OYSTER Pick Friday, June 12th from 7:15 AM to 11:15 AM

Groups: **All harvesters**
Location: **Port Gamble Bay, Port Gamble Heritage Park 250900**
Access: Foot access available from the Heritage Park, Parking is limited do not park on shoulder of hwy. Do Not trespass on private upland property.
Buyer: Buyer will purchase oysters at the harvest site. Buyer will not provide bags.

Start time is 7:15PM. This is an in-common opening with 5,000 dozen oysters combined treaty quota. Harvest will end when total is reached

3) BAIT Clam Dig Tuesday, June 16th from 12:00 PM to 3:00 PM

Group: **All Diggers**
Location: **Dyes Inlet, Silverdale Shoal (Clam Island), 260540**
Access: **BOAT ACCESS ONLY**
Buyer: Harvesters encouraged to take home or set up buyer arrangements before the harvest. Buyer may be on site.

Start time is 12:00 PM or when beach exposed and will end at 3:00 PM or when the tide is in. Final quota will be determined by the monitor.

*****Due to biotoxins, other closures, and weather events, clam harvests may be postponed with short notice*****

SUBSISTENCE CLAMS AND OYSTERS OPENINGS

The following beaches are open for all oysters and clams, **except cockles:**

- Jeff Head Beach
- East Indianola Beach
- Tribal Center Beach **Closed for Oysters**
- Clam Island (Dyes Inlet)

Opened to all Bivalves including cockles

- Anna Smith Children's Park
- Fay Bainbridge State Park
- South Pt. Monroe
- Shine Tidelands
- Wolfe Property State Park
- Illahee State Park
- Indian Island County Park

Harvesters must report totals to the fisheries office within 72 hours of harvest. Permits are required for ceremonial harvests.
